


IB Coordinators' Message




Catchment Area for BDM

- We are very pleased to let you know that effective September 2026, Bishop David Motiuk will be the designated school for students residing in the Big Lake area, including the neighbourhoods of Trumpeter, Starling, Hawks Ridge, Kinglet Gardens, and Pintail Landing will join our school community in Kindergarten through Grade 9. We remain the designated school for students residing in Stewart Greens, Webber Greens, Suder Greens, Potter Greens, and Breckenridge Greens. We are so pleased to welcome these new families to our school community.
- We understand that families may have questions about space and capacity. Bishop David Motiuk Catholic Elementary/Junior High School is well-equipped to welcome new students from the Big Lake area. With the recent opening of St. Josephine Bakhita Catholic Elementary/Junior High School, our school has the facilities and resources to support all students and maintain a positive learning environment for both current and new families.

Registering at BDM

With new boundary changes that will impact student enrolment to some extent, we will once again adhere closely to ECSD Administrative Procedure 300: Admission of Students, so new registrations will be accepted in the following order:

- 1. Resident* students in catchment area;
- 2. Resident students residing outside the catchment area;
- 3. Non-resident students residing within the catchment area; and
- 4. Non-resident students residing outside the catchment area.
- * A resident student is a student who is Catholic or who has one parent who is Catholic.





Pre-Registration for Current ECSD Students

Parents of students currently enrolled at Bishop David Motiuk are asked to pre-register for the 2026-2027 school year by completing the pre-registration form in PowerSchool. The pre-registration form will be open on Monday, February 2 through Friday, March 13. Instructions will be sent by the division in a Broadcast message to parents of all current registrants.



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Students Transferring To or From Another ECSD School

Parents of students currently enrolled in Edmonton Catholic Schools who wish to transfer **to** Bishop David Motiuk from another Catholic school or who wish to transfer **from** Bishop David Motiuk to another Catholic school **are not** required to complete new registration applications. Upon acceptance at Bishop David Motiuk or another Catholic school, files will be transferred from the student's current school.

All parents are asked to declare which school they intend to register in for the upcoming school year by completing the pre-registration screen in PowerSchool when it opens on February 2. The process takes less than a minute.

Once pre-registration screens have been completed, the principal of the school will review all transfer requests. Information about acceptance or non-acceptance will be communicated to families. In the event that a principal is unable to accept a new registration, the student will be assigned to their designated school by default. At that point, parents may choose to submit a request to a different school or accept registration at their designated school.



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New Registration Applications for Kindergarten - Grade Nine

Registrations for students who are new to Edmonton Catholic Schools are done online. To register, please visit our division Register Today page. The principal will review new applications to determine eligibility and will contact families regarding applications. Online registration applications are not considered complete until we have received all required documents. These include:

- **ECSD Registration Form**
- **Birth certificate**
- Baptismal certificate (for sacramental preparation, if applicable)
- Landed immigrant certificate (if applicable)
- Copy of current report card
- ** Proof of address
- Complementary course form (online JH only)

Please note: students registering for kindergarten must be 5 years of age by December 31 of their kindergarten year.

MAC and its academic programs. Please note: Admission to MAC typically requires a minimum average of 75% or higher in all core subjects.


MAC does not offer dash 2 level courses, except for Math 30-2 in Grade 12.

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Extended Vacations

It's that time of year when many of our families are booking extended vacations. Please keep in mind that our classrooms are dynamic learning environments that are fluid and constantly changing. Work assigned is often project-based and is designed to promote critical thinking and a deeper level of student engagement. Even though tools such as Google classrooms are useful in terms of staying connected with the classroom, they are not substitutes for face-to-face learning and participation in learning activities. Consequently, we recommend that families avoid booking vacation time during the school year. This is especially important for students in grades six and nine, where students write provincial achievement tests. Another consideration for grade nine students is that their marks will determine which courses they may take in high school. Frequent absences may impact their academic performance at school.

If booking vacation time at natural breaks in the school year is not possible, or if a student must be away for truly important events or family emergencies, then parents are asked to contact the teacher to find out what general topics of study will be examined while the student is away. The student will be expected to review relevant course materials and monitor assignments being posted to Google classrooms, with the understanding that the student will likely have work to make up when he or she returns to school. It is the responsibility of the student to see each of his or her teachers to find out what work was missed during an absence and to complete all missed work, assignments and/or exams.



It Is Not Cool to Be Cold

Did You Know?

- Snow forts and tunnels can collapse and suffocate a child
- When children are outside, they often do not realize how cold they are becoming
- Bright sun during the winter can cause a sunburn



What Parents Can Do:

- Signs of frost nip are slight pain and whitening of the affected area e.g. tips of the ears turn white. Warm the affected area by breathing on it or warming it with your hands but do not rub. Do not apply snow or water.
- Supervise children when they play outside.
- Choose play areas with warm shelters nearby.
- Provide children with a neck warmer instead of a scarf to prevent strangulation on playground equipment.



It Is Not Cool to Be Cold


What Kids Can Do:

- If you feel pain in your fingers, toes, ears, cheeks, nose or chin, get inside to warm up.
- Dress in layers. If you get too warm take off one layer at a time.
- Wear sunscreen on exposed skin on sunny days.
- Don't put your tongue on cold metal

If you can only remember one thing:

Most of our body heat is lost through our heads, so always wear a hat or toque in cold weather.






Pull Tabs for Wheelchairs

Entering Absence Information

- With the sheer number of students at our school, it can take a few hours for office staff to go through phone messages regarding student absences. This sometimes results in call-outs, even though parents have left messages, simply because staff have not had the chance to listen to all of the messages before the call-outs begin.
- Parents, please help us by entering attendance information for your children directly in PowerSchool:
 - 1. Open PowerSchool,
 - 2. Select "School Messenger" from the icons on the left,
 - 3. Click the calendar at the top for attendance,
 - 4. Click to report an absence.



Transportation



Bus Service in Severe Weather Conditions

When the temperature outside reaches -20 with the windchill or colder, students are kept inside. If they arrive in the morning prior to the start of supervision at 8:20, then they are to enter through the main doors and wait in the foyer until supervision begins. At that time, they will make their way to classrooms. Recess will also be indoors.

Our transportation system has an excellent record for service. However, given the possible extremes of Edmonton weather and the potential for unexpected mechanical difficulties, it is impossible to guarantee buses will run on time or at all. A route can take 50% longer in adverse weather conditions. Parents are advised that if a bus does not arrive within twenty minutes of its scheduled time, they are to assume the bus is not coming. Parents must ensure that their child knows to return home or to a pre-selected location. Parents must then make alternate arrangements to get their child to school.



Bus Service in Severe Weather Conditions

Parents should also ensure that:

- children are supervised at the bus stop
- children have a place to go in the event the bus does not arrive
- children have alternate arrangements for getting to school should the bus
- transportation also apply in severe weather conditions. The Carrier is responsible for notifying the School and the Transportation Services office when a route is running late.

Parents then have access to 3 different resources (by calling either the school, the Transportation Services office, or directly contacting the carrier) to get an update on the status of a particular route.

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
Bus Planner Delays App



- General notices for all subscribers.


Users can download and access the BusPlanner Delays App via the Apple or Android app stores.


The division is once again asking for parent feedback. Assurance surveys will be sent home in January. Please take a few minutes to complete the surveys. Thank you!




Winter Concert

We are looking forward to a wonderful evening!




BDM Open House Information

Our Open House includes a short general program followed by self-guided tours of the school. Information about kindergarten and International Baccalaureate Programmes will also be available.


