Administrators' Message

We are very pleased to welcome our students and staff back to school following the recent strike and lockout.

We recognize that the past days have been challenging for families, and we sincerely thank you for your patience, understanding, and support during this difficult time.

Teachers have been ordered to return to work. You may not realize that most of the monetary gains teachers make through the imposed four-year contract will be offset by lost wages during job action. Teachers were willing to make this sacrifice in hopes of creating better learning conditions for students. It is important to acknowledge, however, that many of the concerns that led to the job action remain unresolved. We continue to pray for meaningful dialogue and progress, trusting that all parties will work toward solutions that uphold the dignity and well-being of our students, staff, and school communities.

We have received several questions from families regarding academic progress and extracurricular activities. At this time, the Government of Alberta has <u>not</u> indicated that time lost during job action will be made up. With this in mind, timetables and the school calendar will remain unchanged. As always, our dedicated staff will do all they can to ensure that students are able to access the curriculum effectively, so that learning continues without interruption.

Extracurricular activities and field trips are made possible through the generosity and commitment of school staff who *volunteer* their time to coach, supervise, and lead student experiences beyond the classroom. This includes activities such as sports teams, clubs, band trips, concerts and many other events. 



School Site Safety App

Many parents choose to drive their children to school. ECSD has launched a School Site Safety application to assist parents in parking safely in the area around the school. To access the app, please click on the School Site Safety icon on our website or visit School Site Safety. Rather than simply dropping off their children, many parents choose to park, walk with their children to school, then wait with them until the doors open. These parents are asked to park safely, either on the street or in the neighbourhood, taking care not to block driveways. Students who are not accompanied by a parent are asked to cross the street at the controlled crossing at the corner of Webber Greens Drive and Lewis Greens Drive rather than at the crosswalk on 93 Avenue, or at the crosswalk with flashing pedestrian lights at the north entrance to the school.

There are many, many vehicles in the area at drop off and pick up times. Please recognize this, be patient, and understand that it may take up to a half hour to navigate traffic in the area at peak times.

Thank you for your attention to these important safety considerations.


