#### II. BUSINESS OF THE MEETING

### 2. Operating Procedures – Presented by Dwayne V.

-At our next school council meeting, we will be reviewing and making any amendments to our Operating Procedures. Operating Procedures can be viewed on the Bishop David school website. Please reach out if there are any changes you'd like to make or you can vote to leave them "as is".

### B. Admin Report: Presented by Principal Volk

Normally we would be reviewing PAT and Assurance Survey Results right around now, but they are currently embargoed, so we are not able to discuss them. We can let you know that based on our marks from June, our results should be consistent with prior years. Marks from June were lower than what we hoped for in math. So, we are going to add that as a focus again in our School Plan.

Right now, we are dealing with items that have been impacted by the Teachers' strike in October.

#### 1. Teacher Morale

One of our primary focuses right now is supporting teacher morale. Understandably, many teachers are feeling demoralized, unappreciated, and, in some cases, deeply discouraged. Our division chaplain, Fr. Glenn, has described much of what teachers are experiencing as a form of "moral trauma." Teachers entered the strike with sincere and principled intentions, advocating for class size and complexity concerns that directly affect student learning. There was a genuine belief that, even if negotiations stalled, things would eventually be settled through binding arbitration, which would involve some give and take on both sides. That did not happen and the notwithstanding clause was used to legislate teachers back to work.

Teachers are also deeply affected by the instructional time that was lost during the strike. Many are worried not only about helping students regain momentum, but also that after sacrificing that time for what they believed was a principled stand, they have little to show for it. The financial loss was significant, and many teachers know it will take years to recover. This has intensified the disappointment and fatigue some are feeling.

Despite these challenges, our teachers continue to show remarkable dedication. They are doing well overall, yet many feel underappreciated—particularly regarding extracurricular commitments such as choir, clubs, and teams. These activities rely entirely on teachers' volunteer time, often at the expense of time with their own families. Teachers care deeply about their students and remain committed to honouring their extracurricular responsibilities for this school year. However, we may see fewer teachers taking on these roles next year as they work to rebuild balance and protect their well-being. So one of our focuses will be on educating parents as to what a teachers' job actually entails, since there are so many misconceptions about what teachers do.

Dwayne and Jenn G asked what can we do to help? Parents and students are encouraged to just keep letting teachers know that they are appreciated Special thank you to Mrs. Santin for representing the teachers at our SAC meetings!

### 2. IB Self-Study and Evaluation

As you know, our IB self-study and evaluation visit was scheduled for this year. With the strike, we lost a great deal of time in getting our initial paperwork ready. It is important that the process be authentic and that teachers have time to reflect on what we have achieved. The problem is that IB is already more work for teachers than is expected in a regular school and teachers are feeling demoralized and stressed right now, which complicates things. So, with the support of the division, we asked for and received an extension for our self-study and evaluation. Our paperwork will be submitted by June and our visit will be in October of next year.

### 3. Class Size/Complexity Information

We are currently working on gathering class size/complexity information to be submitted to the government. The timeline is tight – due next week. We are lucky in that our instructional coaches are ultra efficient and we have been keeping records of the type Alberta Education is looking for – which are quite complex. They include information such as:

Full Time Equivalents (FTE) for staff. This includes:

- Full-time and Part-time teachers (certificated teachers only)
- · Principal/School Leader
- · Assistant/Vice Principal
- · Educational Assistants
- · Counselors
- · Curriculum/Learning Leaders
- · Inclusive/Diverse Education Coordinators
- · Coaches/Teaching Supports
- · Non-teaching staff members
- \*Clerical/Custodial staff are not included in counts.
